

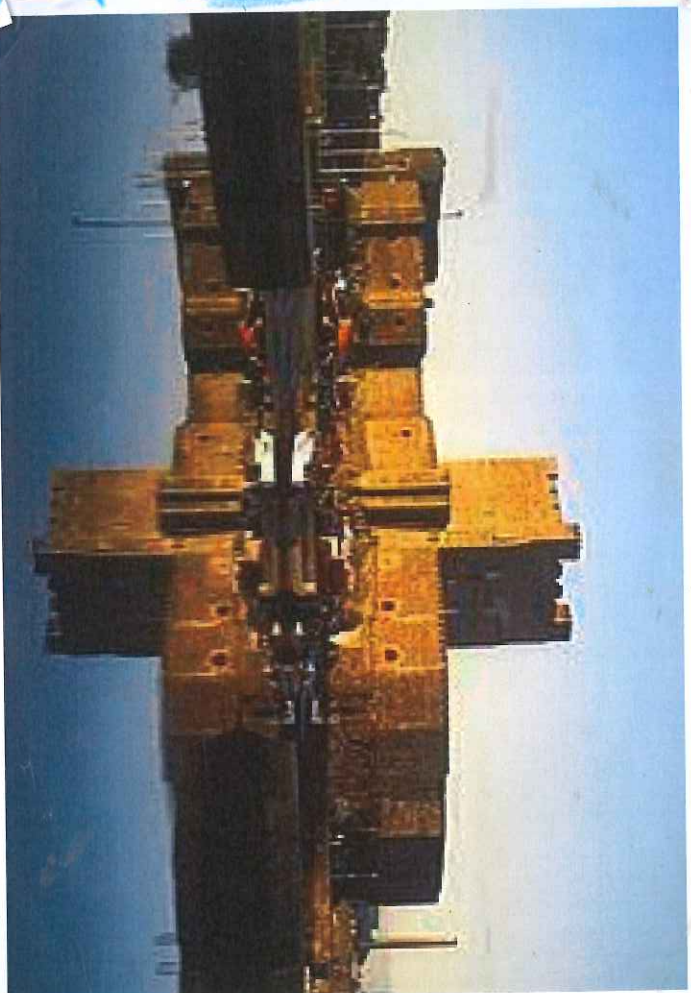
carrickfergus castle

carrickfergus is a preserved medieval structure in Northern Ireland.

It was built and the three timbers still stand today.

on the day of the wedding 29 April Prince William and Kate of Cambridge Duke of Cambridge Earl of Strathmore and Baron Carrickfergus

3/4 of the castle perimeter surrounded by water.



carrickfergus was built by John de Courcy in 1177

ordnance store and it was used as a garrison during the second world war as an air raid shelter.

It appears from the official English records in 1210 when King John laid siege to it and took control of what was then Ulster's premier garrison.

A Norman castle in Northern Ireland situated in the town of Carrickfergus in County Antrim on the northern shore of Belfast Lough.
